### **Fort Snelling is home to Wall of Heroes**

A new memorial at Fort Snelling, MN, pays homage to the 17 Army Reserve soldiers who have died in Iraq since 2003, including those from Wisconsin.

The Wall of Heroes was officially unveiled at a memorial ceremony held on July 9<sup>th</sup> for friends and relatives of soldiers who have died in the war. A permanent monument will be placed at the 88<sup>th</sup> Army Reserve Readiness Command (RSC) Blue Devil Museum. The monument contains plaques with the etched faces of each soldier and patriotic inscriptions about it.
