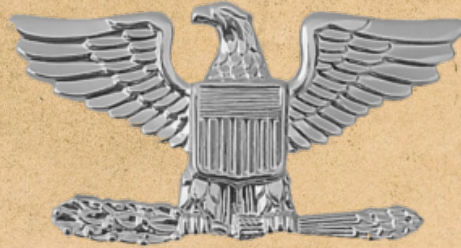




# Railsplitter Obituary

Colonel Gordon B. "Corky" Jacobs, 86, a resident of Lakeview Estates, was called home to his Lord on Sunday, January 19, 2014.
